International Nuclear Service (INS)

- INS is a 100% owned subsidiary of the NDA
- INS manages the commercial contracts for services provided by Sellafield Ltd to UK and Overseas utility customers
- Negotiates new contracts
- Operates an international nuclear transport service
- Locations: Pelham House, Barrow, Risle, France, Germany, Japan



INS Update – Pacific Heron



- New ship Pacific Heron handed over in April 2008
- Arrived in Barrow in mid-June 2008
- Period of sea-trials has been underway
- Orders placed for 2 further vessels



INS Update – Pacific Teal



- Decommissioning of the Pacific Teal has been completed
- Over 96% of the vessel has been recycled



INS Update – Uranium (UO₃) Export



- A successful export of UO₃ from Sellafield for Thorp customers was recently completed
- Discussions continue with other customers to develop export plans and prepare for future UO₃ exports



INS Update – Vitrified Residue Returns

- All new overseas reprocessing contracts since 1976 provide for return of waste to customers
- Discussions are progressing with Japanese and European customers on the detailed arrangements and programme for Vitrified Residue (HLW) returns from Sellafield



INS Update – SVAFO Fuel Reprocessing



- Reprocessing of the fuel delivered from SVAFO (Sweden) in 2007 has been successfully completed
- Plans are being developed for the return of wastes following the reprocessing of this fuel

INS - Summary

- INS operates an international transport business and manages and develops commercial contracts with utility customers for Services provided by Sellafield Ltd.
- INS supports the NDA in its aim to maximise commercial value from existing assets and operations.
- These activities make a significant contribution to NDA revenues and contribute to the funding of the NDA's decommissioning and clean-up activities.
