**Feedback on Site end states consultation  
Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> November 2007**

Many thanks for arranging for representatives from the NDA and AMEC to present the findings from the consultations that the WCSSG ran on 'site end uses' and 'site end states' on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> November.

I enclose for your information a brief 'note for the record' of the meeting and would like to summarise what my understanding of the outcome from that meeting was.

Following lots of dialogue and discussion, I feel that two main conclusions emerged which were:

- The NDA needs to ensure dialogue with local authorities recognising that any move forward needs to be reconciled with planning issues.
- The group welcomed the fact that the site end state process would be regularly reviewed on a 5 yearly basis and opened up to consultation in order to take account of any changing technology / situations.

On the basis that the above is built into the process moving forward, then the consensus of opinion was that the conclusions were acceptable to the group.

I look forward to any updates as the process evolves and hope that the exercise was useful for yourself.
